Your Essential Guide for a Smooth Start as an Expat

Before You Arrive
☐ Check visa requirements (working visa, student visa, visitor visa)
☐ Apply for your visa and gather necessary documents (passport, photos, work contract, etc.)
☐ Book short-term accommodation (hotel, Airbnb, or hostel for first weeks)
☐ Research your destination city (Taipei, Taichung, Kaohsiung, etc.)
☐ Learn basic Mandarin phrases
☐ Join expat Facebook groups or forums (e.g. "Taiwan Expats", "Taipei Community")
☐ Get international travel insurance for the first 1–2 months
☐ Prepare 2–3 months of living expenses in cash and digital formats
Housing & Essentials
☐ Use 591.com.tw or local Facebook groups to find apartments
☐ Choose between shared housing or private rental
☐ Prepare a rental deposit (usually 2 months' rent)
☐ Buy essentials or second-hand items (furniture, appliances)
☐ Learn about trash sorting & recycling rules (strict in Taiwan)

	☐ Visit IKEA, Carrefour, or local markets for setup supplies
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	Phone & Internet
	☐ Get a local SIM card at the airport or phone shop (Chunghwa, FarEasTone, Taiwan Mobile)
	☐ Sign up for a monthly mobile plan or prepaid option
	☐ Set up internet in your apartment (if not included)
	☐ Download essential apps:
	☐ Google Translate (Mandarin camera scan is helpful!)
	☐ Line (main chat app in Taiwan)
	☐ Foodpanda / Uber Eats
	☐ Taiwan Weather App
	☐ iBon or E-traffic apps for MRT, buses, payments
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	☐ Open a local bank account (CTBC, Mega Bank, or Post Office)
	☐ Bring your ARC (Alien Resident Certificate), passport, and proof of address
	☐ Apply for an EasyCard for transport and small payments
	☐ Learn how to pay bills via convenience stores or ATM machines

	☐ Apply for your ARC (Alien Resident Certificate) within 15 days of arrival (if eligible)
	☐ Enroll in Taiwan's National Health Insurance (NHI) after receiving ARC
	☐ Choose a local clinic or hospital for general care
	☐ Get a dental check-up (affordable and widely available)
	☐ Keep a translated copy of any essential medical records
•	Work & Admin
	☐ Register with the local immigration office if staying long-term
	☐ Apply for a work permit (your employer usually handles this)
	☐ Save your tax ID number and check deadlines for tax filing (May each year)
	☐ Learn basic workplace etiquette and public behavior norms
X	Social & Lifestyle
	☐ Join a local gym, hiking group, or yoga class
	☐ Explore your neighborhood's night markets and temples
	☐ Take Mandarin classes at a university or language center
	☐ Connect with other expats through meetups or events
	☐ Explore weekend trips to Jiufen, Taroko Gorge, Alishan, or Kenting

Bonus Tips

Ш	Always carry your ARC or a copy of your passport
	Carry cash—small shops may not accept cards
	Respect cultural customs (remove shoes indoors, use two hands to give/receive items)
	Be patient with bureaucracy—it takes time but works smoothly
	Be open to new foods, experiences, and rhythms of life!
